Role Overview:

The Director-at-Large doesn't have specific duties but they're often assigned tasks by the Chair which can align with their skill sets.

Other than having flexible duties, a Director-at-Large is as influential as any other Board member. They attend Board meetings, can join committees, and are full voting members. A Director-at-Large can also serve as a committee chair.

Key Responsibilities:

- participating in Board meetings
- providing input on key decisions
- contributing expertise or guidance on matters relevant to the organization's mission and objectives.
- exercising full voting rights as needed
- participating in committees and/or serve as chair of a committee
- carrying out other duties assigned by the Chair.

General Board Commitments

- Meeting Attendance:
 - Attend and actively participate in all Board meetings, both scheduled & special.
- Preparation:
 - Prepare for meetings by reviewing agendas, minutes, and relevant materials in advance.
- Collaboration:
 - Work collaboratively with fellow Board members and staff to achieve the organization's goals.
